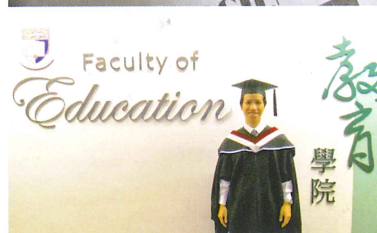
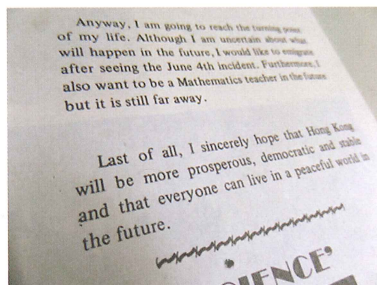
As a child

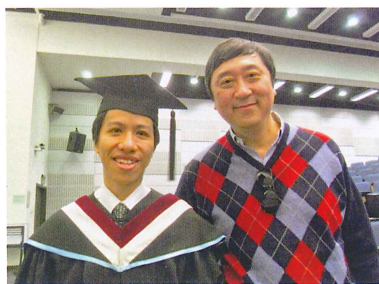

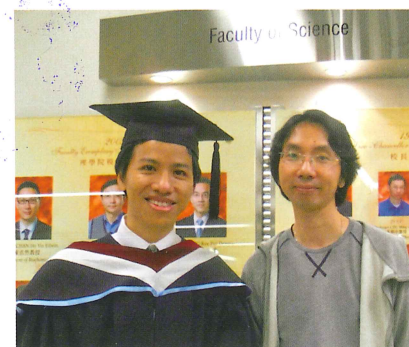
Future

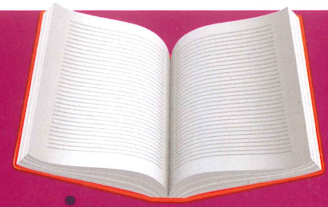

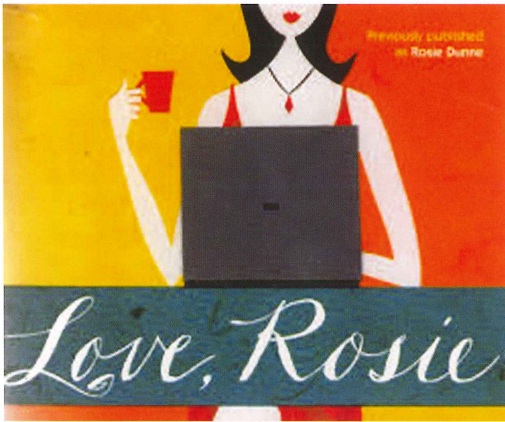
Love Rosie

After marriages and divorces, job interviews and promotions, babies and growing up – they finally come to a point and realise that they need and have love each other so much that it makes them inseparable.

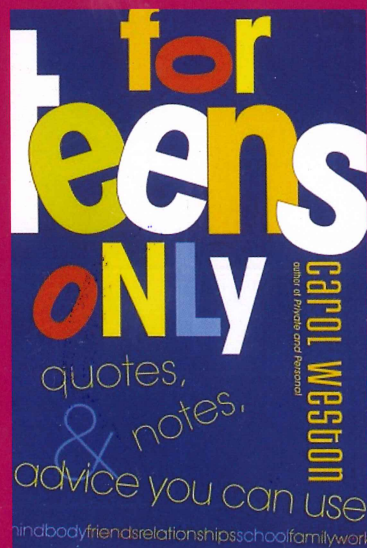


Reflection:

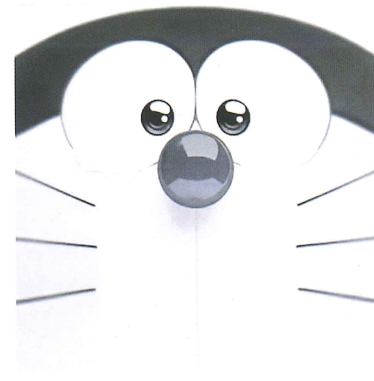

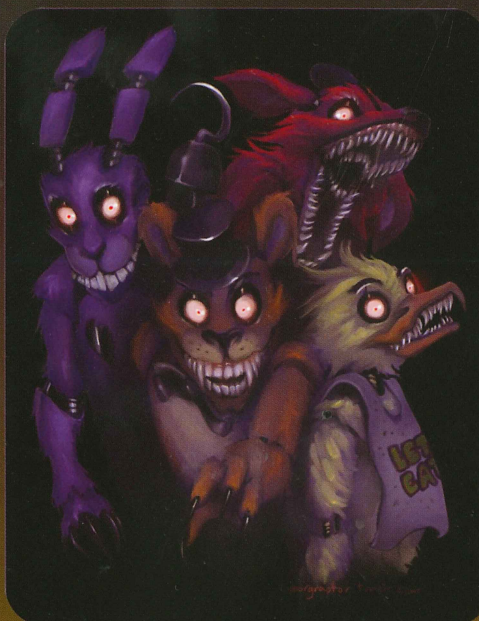

five nights at freddy's

5 Nights At Freddy's is a horror game presented by Scott Cawthon, an individual game developer. Due to its easy but scary gameplay it has been praised by many game websites, along with millions of downloads on iOS, Android and Stream.

The game is about a restaurant called Freddy Fazbear's Pizza in which the attractions for the children are four moving robots. They have a 'lovely' suit and can interact with the children. The robots are Freddy Fazbear (of course), Bonnie the Bunny, Chika the Chick and Foxy the Fox. Unfortunately, they roam at night and may even wonder out (and murder someone), so it is your job as a night guard to bait them. But you have to be careful, if they catch you they will know you're a robot without a suit and forcefully stuff you into a suit -



killing you by suffocation!

You stay at the office, which you can look at the security cameras through the monitor, in case the robots 'accidentally' leave their original place. You need to check the lights outside the office and close doors when necessary. Unfortunately, all of these activities use up the limited power you have, so you must restrict the time doing these activities. If you let one of the robots in, they may not kill you, but will certainly scare you into a coma by the jump scares!

The game also contains extras and 'Easter eggs' (features which need to be closely observed; for example, completing the fifth night can unlock the (harder) night six and the custom night. The Custom night involves attempting to beat the 4 robots on level 20, which is the hardest!

As a conclusion, I recommend this game to all of you unless (1) You are afraid of ultimate jump scares, or (2) you love stuffed Disney characters!

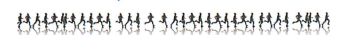
