SCHOOL MISSION

Keeping in step with the spirit of Jesus Christ our Lord, our mission is to provide students with an all-round education aimed at excellence in spiritual, ethical, intellectual, physical, inter-personal and aesthetic development.

We aim at cultivating our students with the qualities of a **LAMWOOER**: leadership, ardour, modesty, wisdom, optimism, originality, empathy and responsibility.

I. OUR SCHOOL

1. General Introduction of the School

Our school is an English grammar school, established by the Hong Kong Sheng Kung Hui in 1970. It is an aided whole-day, co-educational secondary school.

Our school is housed in a 6-storey main building with 3 wings. There are 33 classrooms and 20 special rooms: a school hall, a lecture theatre, a library, a gymnasium, a fitness room, a computer room, a multi-media collaborative learning center, a geography information system room, an oral recording center, an English corner, an English studio, a little chapel, 4 science laboratories, a music room, an art room, a home economics room and a design and technology workshop, together with an open playground and a covered playground. Computers and LCD projectors are installed in all classrooms and special rooms. Smartboards are installed in some classrooms and special rooms as well. Accommodation and facilities are well maintained. The buildings and even the canteen are kept clean, tidy and are fully air-conditioned.

Owing to the high academic performance of our students, our school is one of the top schools in the Kwai Ching District and one of the top secondary schools in Hong Kong.

2. School Management

2.1 The Incorporated Management Committee

The Incorporated School Management Committee was established on 31 August 2015. It consists of 13 members with Dr. Alice Yuk, BBS, JP, our school supervisor, as the Chairperson, and Mr. Cheung Chee Yin as the Honorary Treasurer.

2.2 Staff

There were 62 teaching staff members (including the Principal), 3 laboratory technicians, 9 clerical staff members, 2 assistant teachers, 2 technical support staff members and 10 janitors.

2.3 Qualifications of the Principal and Teachers

- I. 98.4% obtained a bachelor's degree.
- II. 68.8% obtained a master's degree.
- III. 3.1% obtained a doctor's degree.
- IV. 100% received formal teacher training.

2.4 Professional Development of the Principal and Teachers

2.5 Staff Development Committee

The Staff Development Committee has organised various programmes including staff development days, an induction programme, a mentoring scheme and team building activities throughout the academic year.

On the staff development days, different talks and workshops were arranged. Firstly, there was the “Kwai Tsing Joint School Development Day”. In the morning session, a talk on “How to help the young set a more long-term goal and enhance their willingness to serve the community” was hosted by Mr. Andrew Choi and Dr. Jonathan Choi. The afternoon session was for teachers’ retreat.

On the second staff development day, a talk on “Tackling the students with emotional problems” and a workshop on “Crisis Management” were hosted by Dr. Samuel Leung and Ms. Rainey Chik respectively.

Thirdly, there was a session on “Holistic Review and Further Development on School Development Cycle”. Teachers had a genuine discussion on the issues related to the four domains.

On the fourth staff development day, there was the “HKSKH Joint Schools Staff Development Day”. The theme of the event was “Our Faith, Our Way”. Most teachers found Father Thomas Kwan’s sharing session down-to-earth and inspiring.

Our mentorship scheme has been implemented for many years to develop the professionalism of new teachers and teaching assistants. The Induction Programme was conducted for new teachers and laboratory technicians. Ten teachers were appointed as mentors to give advice and support to the new teaching staff. Each new member would have two mentors: one academic mentor and one pastoral care mentor.

In order to establish close links with tertiary teacher training institutions and to nurture the next generations of teachers, teaching practice for student teachers from tertiary institutions were arranged. There was also the school-university partnership with HKU. Teaching practice placement for three PGDE students and one BA & BEd student were offered. Three student teachers who are our alumni also completed their teaching practicum and school attachment in our school respectively.

To promote a sharing culture among our teaching staff, the first ten minutes of each staff development day was allotted for teachers’ sharing. Teachers were invited to share their experiences which enhanced our mutual understanding and broadened our horizons.

The staff development fund encouraged and subsidised our colleagues to enrol in courses related to teaching or well-being purposes. It was highly appreciated by our teachers.

In short, the staff development activities this year have achieved the goal of enhancing the personal development and professionalism of our staff, nurturing the next generation of teachers, as well as developing the camaraderie among our colleagues.

2.6 Teacher Commendation Scheme

To acknowledge outstanding teachers and show respect for teachers, the Committee of 'Respect Our Teachers Campaign' organised the 23rd Teacher Commendation Scheme. Mr. Cheng Hong Yung and Ms. Lee Siu Mei were nominated by teachers and students respectively as our school's nominees. Mr. Lau Kan Lung was also nominated by the school as "Outstanding Teacher" for another campaign which was organised by the Federation of Parent-Teacher Association (Kwai Tsing District) Ltd.

II. ACHIEVEMENTS AND REFLECTION ON MAJOR CONCERNS

1 Major Concern 1: Lifelong Learning

The target of the theme was to cultivate students with positive attitudes and good learning habits, and also equip them with good learning skills.

- Arranging structured “Reading To Learn” lessons to cultivate good reading habits, including:
 - Reading log for every student to build a good reading habit;
 - Sharing by all students on their reflections from reading to extend reading beyond campus; and
 - Planning for better use of Grant for promotion of reading to boost reading atmosphere.

Target 2: Effective lessons

- More targeted co-planning and lesson observation were conducted, focusing on High-order thinking, Engagement, Levelled questions, Positive atmosphere (HELP).
- The Open Classroom effectively enhanced internal professional exchange.
- Structured mobile learning activities were organised for all forms and subjects. Teachers were able to make use of different features of e-learning to allow more interactive lessons and lesson preparation activities.

STEM development was promoted, including:

- A 3-tier STEM policy for STEM development: Tier 1 for whole school; Tier 2 for interested students; Tier 3 for talented students and “Makers”.
- Tier 1: School-based curriculum to enhance programming.
- Tier 1: Workshops for Micro:bit programming were organised for both teachers and students.
- Tier 2: Making use of EDB funds and donations from alumni for purchase of equipment and sponsor students to join competitions.
- Tier 2: Collaborations between Computer Literacy, Science subjects and D&T, in terms of manpower and facilities to help students carry out STEM projects.
- Tier 3: Implementation of joint school STEM programme with SPCC and DGS, with the aid from IT company, to nurture entrepreneurship and STEM skills.

2 Major Concern 2: Flourishing Life

Targets of the year

- To promote the positive education model, namely PERMA (Positive Emotions, Engagement, Relationships, Meanings and Accomplishment), and GRIT on campus.
- To help students develop individual strengths and enhance motivation to promote learning and well-being.

Life Buddies Mentoring Scheme

Our school joined Life Buddies Mentoring Scheme, which was launched by the Hong Kong SAR Government in 2015. The mentoring scheme encourages more active participation from businesses and members of the public to become mentors and give aspirations and advice to secondary school students. By participating in the programme, students have improved their life skills, increased their career exposure, developed a vision for their future, made preparation for future studies and set

appropriate career goals.

In 2017-18, our school participated in a number of programmes launched by the scheme, such as School-based Mentoring Programme, Job Tasting Programme and “Be a Government Official for a Day” Programme.

Professional Exchange

With the support of Lam Woo teachers and staff, our flourishing life programme has been recognised by different education institutions which invited us to share with other teachers.

In November 2017, we were invited by Bei Shan Tang Foundation to deliver a talk on positive education to over 200 primary school and secondary school teachers from Chinese International School. Mr. Cheung and Ms. Choi served as guest speakers of the talk. Moreover, Dr. Au was invited by Mental Health and Well-being Conference 2017 to deliver a talk on “Thankfulness programme on positive education” with over 400 local and international educators.

In December 2017, Dr. Au was invited by the EDB to share her experience in applying PERMA framework in a positive education with other educators in EDB Learning and Teaching Expo.

In May 2018, Mr. Fan, Mr. Cheung and two Head Prefects were invited by the EDB to share our school’s positive discipline and discipline system with over 200 secondary school teachers.

In June 2018, we were invited by the EDB to participate in a sharing session on 3-year development of positive education in lessons and activities. Principal Chan, Dr. Au, Mr. Cheung and two F.3 students served as guest speakers of the session.

III. OUR LEARNING AND TEACHING

1. Extended learning experiences

- A large number of gifted students participated in various programmes, including Membership of the HKAGE, Academy for the Talented in the HKU, Dual Programme in the HKUST, Gifted programmes offered by CUHK, web-based learning courses offered by the EDB and scholarship from the Johns Hopkins University.
- Japanese language courses were offered to students as extra-curricular activities.
- F.1 students participated in the STEM Challenges Workshop organised by the school.
- Junior remedial classes on Chinese, English and Mathematics, and after-school tutorial classes on Chinese and Mathematics were offered to students.
- Thanks to Lam Shui Scholarship, an extra CNET teacher was recruited to enhance English learning.
- Junior Science Enrichment Programme, funded by Lam Shui Scholarship, was offered to F.1 and F.2 students. Yau Chi Kin from F.3C demonstrated outstanding performance in the 15th International Junior Science Olympiad Phase III Training and was chosen to represent Hong Kong in the aforementioned competition in Gaborone, Botswana.
- Teachers and students from Saga University Affiliated Junior High School visited Lam Woo in November 2017. They enjoyed activities including class visits as well as presentation about popular hobbies and challenges faced by Japanese and Hong Kong teenagers.

3. Curriculum and assessment

- A bridging programme with EMI subjects (Geography, History, IS, Maths and LS) was organised to help F.1 students adapt to the English learning environment.
- One F.6 student sat the GCE AS-level Japanese Examination 2018 and got Grade A.
- Four students completed Applied Learning programme in various fields. Three of them obtained the highest distinctions.
- One F.4 student studied Music as an X4 subject through a joint-school programme.

4. IT Team

Exploring and promoting new IT learning and teaching strategies are the main objectives of IT team. This year, a STEM Team was established in our unit. The team was formed in order to develop students' potential in all aspects related to STEM. Students would be nominated to join competitions or workshops related to STEM. Also, the team would continue to make more attempts in eLearning and online collaborative learning so as to enrich our learning and teaching in school. At the same time, IT Team also continued the work of maintaining an efficient technical support in assisting learning and teaching. Workshops and sharing sessions were conducted so as to help teachers familiarise themselves with the use of different IT devices. With the Wifi system and mobile devices installed, eLearning activities would be expanded to different subjects. We have installed Surface Pro, iPads and 3D printers to explore new IT learning and teaching strategies across all curriculum.

5. Reading to Learn

The Reading to Learn programme continued its mission to cultivate a reading habit amongst students and encourage extensive reading. A number of activities were carried out, such as Book Crossing, sharing of famous authors and Book Fairs. This academic year, our school participated in the Reading Scheme of Heifer. The money raised is to help impoverished families in mainland China to improve their knowledge and skills in animal rearing and become more self-reliant.

6. Cultural and Art Activities

In junior forms, by adhering to the guidelines provided in the "Arts Lover Passport" issued by the Cultural Promotion Committee, students' sense in artistic creation and appreciation was enhanced via the exploration of performances, museums and galleries. Besides a variety of visual arts exposure, students also enjoyed visits to different fabulous performances offered by various arts organisations, such as the Hong Kong Arts Festival via the participation of Young Friends. In response to the requirement of aesthetic development in OLE, exhibitions, performances and

workshops were introduced to students so as to enhance their aesthetic qualities.

7. Putonghua Promotion Committee

Putonghua Promotion Committee aims at promoting the use of Putonghua in students' daily lives. Students' interest in Putonghua was cultivated through diversified and appealing activities like Drama Broadcast Competition, Singing Contest, Band Shows and game stalls.

8. Chinese Activities Promotion Team

The Chinese Activities Promotion Team raises students' incentive in learning and deepens their knowledge in Chinese culture through various kinds of activities such as Singing Contest, Writing Competition, Lantern Riddles and Film Shows.

9. English Award Scheme

English Award Scheme aims at motivating students to learn and use English via different activities, such as handicraft workshops, competitions and games day, hoping that we can appeal to students with diverse interests and abilities. Whenever students want to be immersed in an English speaking atmosphere at lunchtime or after school, they are welcome to visit the English Corner, which offers students the opportunities to enjoy an array of English board games, English songs or simply chitchat with their peers and our native English teachers. The highlight of the year was the annual English Activity Days in April 2018. Various activities were organised for students of different learning styles to display their talents.

IV. SUPPORT FOR STUDENT DEVELOPMENT

1. Pastoral Care and Religious Education Section

The aim of the section is to coordinate the work between Christian Fellowship and Form Coordination Committee. The section also implemented F.1 Adaptation Programme, Teacher-Student Conference and Lamwoer Awards.

2. Chaplain and Christian Fellowship

Besides regular meetings after school every Friday, the following activities were held:

3. Moral and Civic Education Section

- School assemblies and form teacher lessons were arranged every Day 6 to foster students’ spiritual growth and to promote moral, civic and life education. The topics of school assemblies and form teacher lessons aligned with school concerns and focuses, such as “Lifelong Learning” and “Flourishing Life”.
- National education activities were held around National Day, such as flag hoisting ceremony, a talk, a video show, board displays and game stalls on contemporary China. Mr. Chang Ka Mun from Li & Fung Development Limited was invited to be the guest speaker of National Talk.
- Our section won the Yan Chai Hospital Moral & Civic Education Prize from the EDB. The theme is about nurturing GRIT as character strength in secondary schools.
- Our school participated in a research project organised by The Hong Kong Polytechnic University. The topic was “Well-being in Family Support and Adolescent Development”.
- Our school won the third runner-up in the inter-school Helping Hand Cookie Selling Competition.
- To align with Major Concern 2 “Flourishing Life”, an inter-class Board Display Competition was held in March with representatives from St. James Settlement being the adjudicators.
- To consolidate Chinese virtues, Lunar New Year Cleaning Campaign was held in January 2018.
- The Most Polite Student Election was held in May 2018.
- Thanks to the funding from the EDB, 36 F.4 and F.5 students joined the Hangzhou Study tour and visited our Mainland sister school, Hangzhou Xuejun High School.

4. Discipline Section

In 2017-2018, the prefect team consisted of 59 members. To facilitate students’ leadership potential and build better teamwork, a leadership training camp was held in November 2017. Regular training was also arranged in order to enhance students’ leadership skills and cultivate positive qualities. In addition, the school and the Hong

Kong Police Force worked in close collaboration on providing various police talks to arouse students' awareness of crimes in the community, namely drug abuse, bullying, gambling, online dating, cybercrime and traps in job seeking.

5. Guidance Section

10. Extra-curricular Activities Section

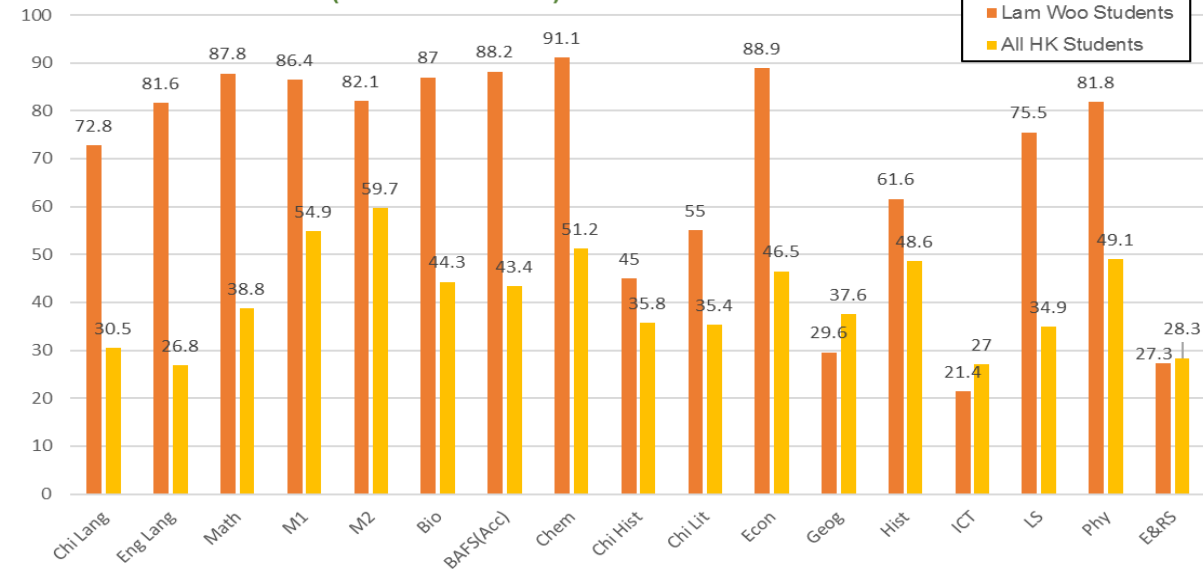
V. STUDENT PERFORMANCE

1. HKDSE Examination 2018

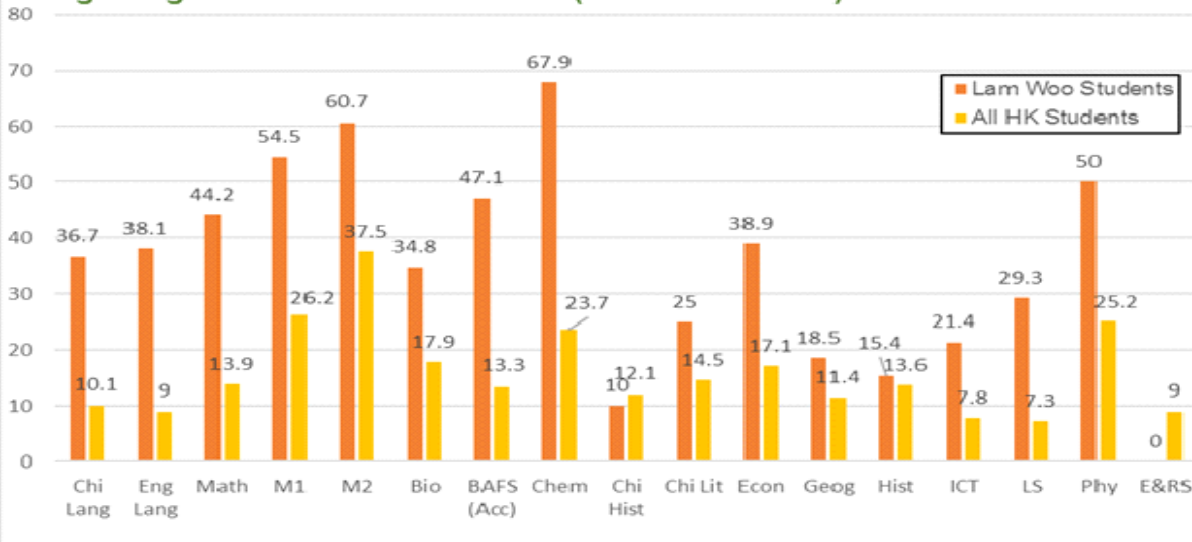
147 F.6 students sat the HKDSE 2018 and they performed very well. They obtained 382 Level 5-5** (including Mathematics Extended Parts and Japanese). On average each student attained Level 5 or above in 2.6 subjects. Thirteen students scored Level 5** in two or more subjects.

103 students (70.1%) obtained 20 grade points or above, which is equivalent to scoring Level 4 or above in 5 subjects. 92.5% of our students met the basic university entrance requirement (33222).

Comparison of results of Lam Woo students with those of all Hong Kong students in HKDSE 2018 (Level 5 or above)



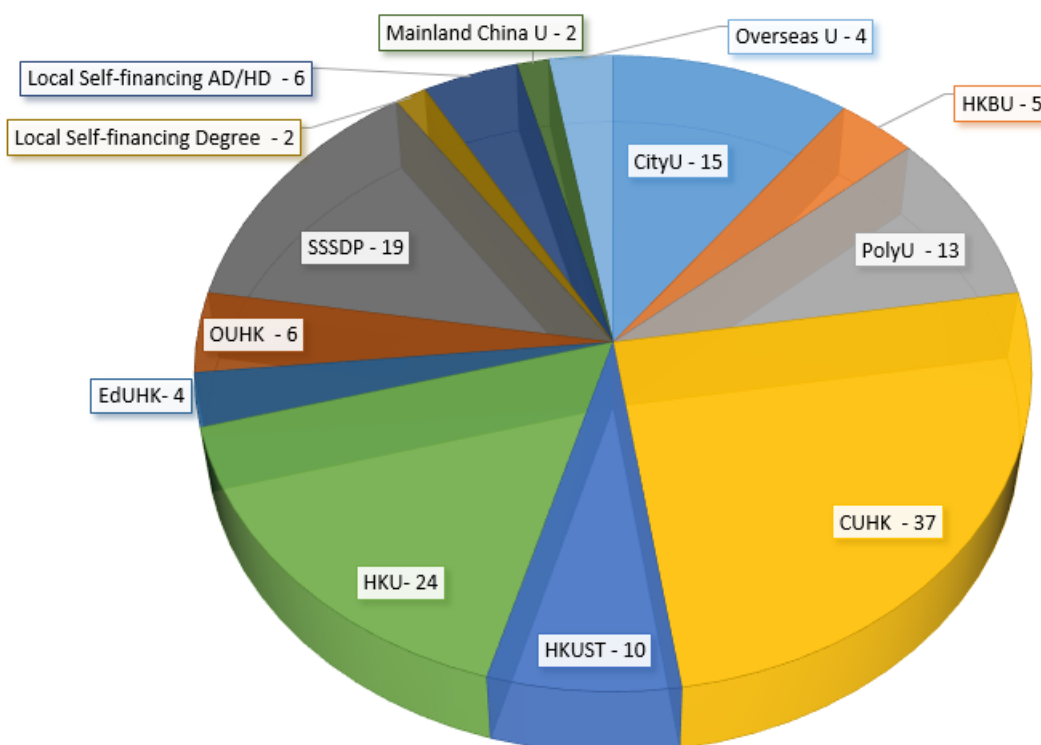
2. JUPAS Offer

137 students (93.8%) were admitted to university through Joint University Programmes Admissions System (JUPAS) (undergraduate programme: 85.6%; associate degree programme or higher diploma course: 8.2%). Eight students were admitted to the Faculty of Medicine and 2 students were admitted to LLB and BBA (Law).

Eight students were granted offers from overseas universities or universities in China, including University of Cambridge, University College London, King’s College London, UC Davis, the University of Warwick, University of Leeds, East China Normal University and Beijing University.
