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I. MISSION STATEMENT

Keeping in step with the spirit of Jesus Christ our Lord, it is our mission to provide students with an all-round education aimed at excellence in spiritual, ethical, intellectual, physical, inter-personal and aesthetic development.

We aim at cultivating our students with the qualities of a LAMWOOER: leadership, ardour, modesty, wisdom, optimism, originality, empathy and responsibility.

II. OUR SCHOOL

General Introduction of the School

Our school is an English grammar school, established by the Hong Kong Sheng Kung Hui in 1970. It is an aided whole-day, co-educational secondary school.

Our school is housed in a 6-storey main building with three wings. There are 33 classrooms and twenty special rooms: a school hall, a lecture theatre, a student activity centre, a library, a gymnasium, a fitness room, a computer room, an English corner, an English studio, a little chapel, four science laboratories, a music room, an art room, a home economics room and a design and technology workshop, together with an open playground and a covered playground. Computers and LCD projectors are installed in all classrooms and special rooms. Accommodation and facilities are well maintained. The buildings and even the canteen are kept clean, tidy and are fully air-conditioned.

Owing to the high academic performance of our students, our school is one of the top schools in the Kwai Ching District and one of the top secondary schools in Hong Kong.

School Management

2.1 The Incorporated Management Committee

The Incorporated Management Committee was established on 31 August 2015. It consists of twelve members with Dr. Alice Yuk Tak Fun, BBS, JP, our School Supervisor, as the Chairperson, and Mr. Peter Cheung Chee Yin as the Honorary Treasurer.

2.2 Staff

There were 59 teaching staff members (including the Principal), four assistant teachers, three laboratory technicians, two IT support staff members, nine clerical staff members and ten janitors.

2.3 Qualifications of the Principal and Teachers

- I. 98% obtained a bachelor's degree.
- II. 56% obtained a master's degree.
- III. 3% obtained a doctor's degree.
- IV. 94% received formal teacher training.

2.4 Professional Development of Teachers

2.5 Staff Development Committee

The Staff Development Committee pledged to continuously develop our staff in order to provide high quality education as well as serving the tertiary education profession.

A series of staff development programmes including guest sharing and workshops were arranged. A talk about "Experiential Learning of Stress Management & Discussion on Teachers' Roles in Boosting Students' Resilience", an "Easy Exercise Workshop" and an e-learning workshop were held to uphold teachers' professionalism. Other activities included "Use of Acupressure and Music Relaxation Practice" and discussion sessions about school policies and book sharing. They not only helped colleagues to relieve their pressure, but also provided an opportunity for colleagues to exchange teaching ideas.

Also, new teachers attended the Induction Programme, which provided comprehensive support for their pedagogy and well-being. In order to nurture the future teacher pipeline and establish a close network with tertiary teacher training institutions, we offered teaching practicum for student teachers from tertiary institutions. On the other hand, the joint school-university partnership programme in collaboration with the University of Hong Kong (HKU) provided our teachers a valuable opportunity to share their expertise and contribute to the teaching profession.

In short, through the staff development activities, the goal of enhancing the professionalism and personal development of our staff, nurturing the next generations of teachers, as well as developing the camaraderie among our colleagues have been achieved.

2.6 Teacher Commendation Scheme

To enhance teachers' image and promote public awareness of respecting teachers, Committee on Respect Our Teachers Campaign organised the 26th Teacher Commendation Scheme. Mr. Lau Kan Lung and Ms. Lee Siu Mei were nominated by teachers and students respectively and received commendation.

^{*}In order to cater for learner diversity, each level of F.4, F.5 and F.6 were split from four into five classes to give students more individual attention and support, and to provide more opportunities for student interaction.

2.8 School Administration and Management System Section

The centralised data management system, WebSAMS, is used to foster the efficiency of school administration and management. To enhance teaching and learning, reports on statistical analysis on students' academic results are provided for evaluation. School-based software is also adopted to promote more systematic data management. To facilitate students' application for university admission, Student Learning Profiles and School Reference Reports are prepared via the system.

The application of HK\$1.2 million QEF fund on STEM lab and related activities was approved in January 2021. The renovation of STEM lab will be completed in 2021.

Lam Woo T-talks

Inspired by TED's mission of "Ideas with spreading", Lam Woo T-talks provided a platform for students and teachers to share their interests, specialties and beliefs. A total of thirty T-talks have been organised since 2018. There were a wide range of topics, from Literature to Human rights; from History to Entertainment. Lightening the scholastic atmosphere ("世事洞明皆學問"), students can learn from their counterparts, and we believe passionately in the power of ideas to change attitudes and lives.

Using data to improve teaching

To enhance teaching effectiveness, the school-based HKDSE Internal Regression Report and the analysis of HKDSE School Statistical Report were given to teachers to evaluate the strengths and weaknesses of our students. Besides, F.5 students were notified the predictions of their grades (HKDSE) this academic year, allowing them to understand their potential and apply for prestigious overseas universities.

Subject Development Project

A three-year subject-based development plan was launched at the beginning of the term. Each subject was required to submit a proposal for improving our current teaching and assessment strategies. The plan was implemented in the second and the third year, and was evaluated afterwards. Ultimately, students could benefit from the latest pedagogy, revised assessments and curriculum.

3.2 Major Concern 2: Flourishing Life of Positive Education

3.3 Major Concern 3: Nurturing Leadership and Enhancing Personal Development of Students

Targets of the year:

- Create more opportunities for students of different abilities to stretch their potential
- Provide strategic training to develop students' leadership qualities.
- Enhance the effectiveness in catering for students with special developmental needs

Leadership training camp for junior form students

The Moral and Civic Education Section organised a leadership training programme including a two-day camp for junior form students in April and August 2021 to develop students' leadership qualities.

Catering for students with special educational needs

The school has been giving guidance support to students with special educational needs. A team with Vice Principal or Assistant Principal being the core members continued to offer help in this academic year. They were responsible for the students' well-being and keeping contact with the parents. Other team members included the concerned form teachers or teachers good at taking care of students with special educational needs. Social workers, educational psychologists and teachers in the Administrative Section or Discipline Section were also invited to help.

3.4 Major Concern 4: Improving Administrative Work Efficiency

Targets of the year:

- Strengthen the communication between students and teachers, teachers and teachers, and parents and teachers through different means of electronic platforms
- Enhance the efficiency of financial management

eClass and ePayment systems

In order to enhance the communications among different stakeholders and to create a green campus, the use of eNotice (electronic parent letter) in the eClass system was implemented. Parents and teachers could promptly check the details of various school activities and important events using mobile devices. Moreover, ePayment system was established and implemented so as to reduce unnecessary administration time for staff and to simplify workflow of handling payment items. Parents could settle various school fees directly using mobile devices.

eBooking system

The eBooking system effectively facilitated the booking process for extra-curricular activities, meetings, supplementary lessons and school events.

Financial management and procurement activities

The guidelines of school-based procurement activities in accordance with their budgets were given to staff. Moreover, the budgets and expenditures of different subjects, sections and committees were reviewed regularly with a view to having better allocation of different funds and financial management.

IV. LEARNING AND TEACHING

4.1 Extended learning experiences

Students were honoured to have various valuable chances to broaden their horizons and enhance the knowledge in their areas of interests. A wide array of gifted programmes hosted by different organisations and universities such as Program for the Gifted and Talented offered by the Chinese University of Hong Kong, the Dual Program offered by the Hong Kong University of Science and Technology and the Inter-school Model United Nations conference have brought great insights to students. In recognition of their scholastic achievements, students were also awarded the Johns Hopkins Center for Talented Youth Scholarship as well as membership of the Hong Kong Academy for Gifted Education and the Academy for the Talented of the University of Hong Kong, which open their gateways to challenging but rewarding learning experiences.

Junior remedial classes on Chinese, English and Mathematics, and after-school tutorial classes on Chinese and Mathematics were offered to students. However, due to COVID-19, some programmes could not be carried out.

4.3 Curriculum and assessment

- A bridging programme with EMI subjects (Geography, History, IS, Mathematics and LS) was organised to help F.1 students adapt to the English learning environment.
- Aligned with Major Concern 1, panel heads reviewed the curricula and considered new elements and pedagogies to their current curricula.

4.4 Adaptation in online learning

Due to COVID-19 pandemic, a hybrid teaching mode, which consists of a mixture of online learning and face-to-face lessons, was adopted. Teachers have equipped essential skills in online teaching and lesson video editing. Thanks to new teaching strategies and platforms, students have adapted to the online learning mode and maintained high quality learning.

4.5 Chinese Activities Promotion Team

The Chinese Activities Promotion Team raises students' incentive in learning and deepened their knowledge in Chinese culture through various kinds of activities such as singing contest, writing competition, lantern riddles and film show.

4.6 Cultural and Art Activities

For junior forms, students' sense in artistic creation and appreciation via the exploration of performances, museums and galleries was enhanced under a LiveCulture programme with the guidelines provided in the "Arts Lover Passport" issued by the Cultural Promotion Committee. Besides a variety of visual arts exposure, students also enjoyed paid visits to different fabulous performances offered by various arts organisations, such as the Hong Kong Arts Festival via the participation of the Young Friends. In response to the requirement of aesthetic development in Other Learning Experiences, exhibitions, performances and workshops vary from campus art to art and crafts workshops were introduced among students so as to help them experience the bliss of beauty.

4.7 English Award Scheme

The English Award Scheme aims at motivating students to learn and use English via different activities, such as handicraft workshops and writing competitions, hoping that we can appeal to students with diverse interests and abilities. Whenever students want to be immersed in an English-speaking atmosphere at lunchtime or after school, they are welcome to visit the English Corner, which offers students the opportunities to enjoy an array of English board games, English songs and films. In addition, students can also chitchat with their peers and our Native-speaking English teachers so as to enhance their communication skills in an authentic context. This year, we launched a variety of activities online in the afternoon, enabling students to be engaged in language games and quizzes so that they would not suspend learning at home.

4.8 Information Technology Team

The IT Team aims at promoting STEM among students and IT in education.

To promote STEM education, we led our students to join various external competitions in the academic year 2020-2021. Besides external competitions, various internal activities were also organised, such as the Faraday Challenge Day for a number of F.1 students, and the Rocket Car Competition Fun Day for all F.2 students.

As for IT in education, there are two aspects of development – facilitating collaboration among colleagues with the use of IT, and promoting among colleagues various useful platforms and tools in e-learning and teaching (e-L&T hereafter).

For the former, we upgraded our Google service to incorporate more functions which facilitate team working, such as more sophisticated shared drives allowing heads of all teams and subjects to easily customise for their own need. Our team also centrally set up online classrooms for all teachers. This made L&T activities more feasible during COVID-19.

As for promoting e-L&T tools, we have introduced interactive whiteboard apps into our mobile learning devices for teachers to borrow so that both online lessons and physical lessons could be conducted with greater clarity. An online platform which better supports student-directed learning and flipped-classroom was also introduced. To better support the

use of mobile devices in classrooms, we have installed screen mirroring tools for mobile devices in all classrooms and some special rooms.

4.9 Reading Promotion Committee

The Reading Promotion Committee continues its mission to cultivate a good reading habit amongst students and encourage extensive reading. Though many events such as competitions and book fares were cancelled due to the pandemic, this year we continued to hold many regular activities so that students could enjoy and even take reprieve amidst such trying times. The online platform e-Read Scheme has been expanded to provide even more materials for students to read on any electronic devices. We are pleased to see students adapting to such digital platforms as reflected in awards such as Chinese Master, TVNews Award Scheme, Reading Contract, and Reading Challenge issued by HKedCity. We have also collaborated with different faculties to foster a more cohesive reading environment on campus, such as displaying outstanding reports recommended by Liberal Studies teachers, and holding a story writing competition "Epicologue" with English Award Scheme. As the pandemic subsides, we hope to engage students in more competitions in the coming year to further engage them in reading.

5.2 Christian Fellowship

Despite the COVID-19 pandemic in the academic year 2020-2021, Christian Fellowship spent much effort in encouraging current members especially F.6 students. They met every Day 2 afternoon to study the Bible and to pray for each other. To cater for the whole school, song dedication was conducted before school begins from time to time to bring positive messages in the midst of the pandemic.

Gospel Week was scheduled from 21st November to 2nd December 2020. In accordance with health protection measures issued by EDB, however, mass events such as assemblies should be avoided. Live hymn singing was conducted during recess and souvenirs were delivered in the Gospel Week. In post-exam period, hymn sharing was launched so as to recruit new members. A video clip of meditation and encouragement was played in classrooms in July 2021.

5.3 Pastoral Care and Religious Education Section

The Pastoral Care and Religious Education Section is the central hub that coordinates all religious activities in the school. It is responsible for religious ceremonies that take place throughout the year and providing programmes for students, especially newcomers, who are interested in the Christian faith. Within the school, the section oversees the work of the Religious Studies panel, Christian Students Fellowship and Christian Teachers Cell Group to provide pastoral support for both students and teachers on campus.

In the academic year 2020-2021, the Beginning of Term Service, the Christmas Service and the Easter Service was held online, while the Commission Service was cancelled. The End of Term Service was the only service which was held face-to-face for the whole school this academic year. Moreover, the 50th Anniversary Thanksgiving Service was smoothly held on 13th November 2020. It is our honour to have the Most Revd. Dr. Kwong to deliver sermon before his retirement. In accordance with health protection measures issued by EDB, F.6 students were arranged to attend the service in Hall while the others joined the service in classrooms through live broadcast.

Although life education was suspended this academic year, a new curriculum framework is under planning with the support of Crown of Thorns Church.

5.4 Discipline Section

The Prefect Team shoulders great responsibilities of assisting the school in maintaining discipline. In the academic year 2020-2021, our prefects, led by two Head Prefects and eight Vice Head Prefects, contributed wholeheartedly to the effective and efficient day-to-day running of the school by keeping order in assemblies, patrolling the campus, checking uniform, arranging seats for various school events, etc. Besides routine duties, they also assisted in special events, such as Parents' Day and Speech Day.

To foster team spirit, confidence and leadership skills of the team, a two-day orientation course was organised in August 2020. By designing and carrying out the programmes, our Head Prefects and Vice Head Prefects demonstrated high capability and close bonding among team members.

5.9 Moral and Civic Education Section

School assemblies and form teacher periods were arranged to foster students' moral and spiritual growth through moral, civic and life education. The topics of school assemblies and form teacher periods aligned with school major concerns and focus on positive education, especially to nurture resilient attitude and coping skills to handle challenges posed by the pandemic.

National education activities were held around National Day, such as flag hoisting ceremony, national quiz, Chinese knots making, Chinese Chess competition, issuing Civic Times and so on. Students also developed their national identity through participating in the constitutional and national quizzes organised by the EDB.

Our school gained a QEF project entitled "My Pledge to Act – Gratitude • Go Forward". With the collaboration from St. James' Settlement, a series of programmes were launched for all students. Among them, 36 F.2 and F.3 students visited an elderly centre through Zoom and 63 F.4 and F.5 students visited a child centre. They enjoyed teaching children Pastel Nagomi Art. In July, two adventure camps and one leadership training camps were held for F.1 to F.4 students respectively. Lastly, a gratitude folder and a journal were issued to every student.

Our school was one of the partner schools of the CUHK Jockey Club Children's Eye Care Programme. There were 32 senior form students engaged in serving children from 6 to 8 years old. Our school also won the second runner-up in the inter-school Helping Hand Cookie Selling Competition. The committee members of the student team won the gold award in the ICAC i-Teen leadership programme. Moreover, the Most Polite Student Election was held in May 2021.

5.10 Old Students' Association

The Old Students' Association (OSA) aims to unite alumni and offer support to current students. Every year, the OSA organises various activities for alumni, including the Basketball League, the Chinese basin cuisine dinner and workshops. Several rounds of the Alumni salon were held in this academic year. Different alumni were invited to share their work experience and personal experience in the salon.

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the OSA organised the computer donation scheme by gathering computers from alumni so as to support students in need of better tools for online learning. A series of online mock university entrance interviews were conducted in July 2020 for F.6 students. The OSA Whole-person Development Fund continues to provide substantial support to current students.

The revised OSA's constitution was approved in the Extraordinary General Meeting held in July 2021. The application of establishing the Recognised Alumni Association was also approved by the school's Sponsoring Body and Incorporated Management Committee. The OSA will hold election in coming future for an Alumni manager on the school's Incorporated Management Committee.

5.11 Parent-Teacher Association

Due to COVID-19, some activities organised by Parent-Teacher Association (PTA), such as charity sale of recycle school uniform, picnic, buffet lunch for all staff in the Parents-Also-Appreciate Teachers Campaign, were suspended. Nevertheless, the parents' group '「家」添茶座' and Parents Fellowship organised fourteen meetings to let parents get to know each other, exchange different expertise, and share the experience of nurturing their children. It has become a tradition for parents to bake delicious cookies to cheer our F.6 students in December.

The PTA Volunteer Team assisted in examination invigilation, students' outing activities and clerical work in office and library. Besides, PTA donated funds to subsidise various activities such as Leadership Training Programme and Prefect Training Programme.


5.12 School Health Promotion Committee

Vaccination services and dental care schemes were provided to students to help secure their health. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, most of the large-scale events, like sports week and F.3 inter-class cross country competition, were cancelled. SHPC also offered assistance in checking students' body temperature in the morning every school day to help maintain a healthy and safe environment for all the staff and students.

VI. STUDENT PERFORMANCE

6.1 HKDSE 2021


121 F.6 students sat the HKDSE 2021 and they performed very well. They obtained 316 Level 5 to 5** (including Mathematics Extended Parts and Japanese). On average each student attained Level 5 or above in 2.61 subjects. Seven students scored Level 5** in two or more subjects. 6E Yau Chi Kin achieved 5** in six subjects and 5* in two subjects. 86 students (71.1%) obtained 20 grade points or above, which is equivalent to scoring Level 4 or above in five subjects. 90.1% of our students met the basic university entrance requirement (33222).



6.2 JUPAS 2021 and offers from overseas universities

118 students applied for the Joint University Programmes Admissions System (JUPAS). 117 (99.1%) of them were admitted to university (degree programme: 89.8%) to read Medicine, Dental Surgery, Pharmacy, Physiotherapy, International Research Enrichment, Speech and Hearing Sciences, Laws, Financial Technology, Insurance, Financial and Actuarial Analysis, Applied Artificial Intelligence, Psychology, etc. 30 university offers were received from non-local universities.
