SCHOOL MISSION

Keeping in step with the spirit of Jesus Christ our Lord, our mission is to provide students with an all-round education aimed at excellence in spiritual, ethical, intellectual, physical, inter-personal and aesthetic development.

We aim at cultivating our students with the qualities of a **LAMWOOER**: leadership, ardour, modesty, wisdom, optimism, originality, empathy and responsibility.

I. OUR SCHOOL

1. *General Introduction of the School*

Our school is an English grammar school, established by the Hong Kong Sheng Kung Hui in 1970. It is an aided whole-day, co-educational secondary school.

Our school is housed in a 6-storey main building with 3 wings. There are 31 classrooms, 14 special rooms: a school hall, a library, an open playground, a covered playground, a gymnasium, a fitness room, a computer room, a multi-media collaborative learning center, a collaborative learning centre, an English corner, an English studio and a lecture theatre. Computers and LCD projectors are installed in all classrooms and special rooms. Accommodation and facilities are well maintained. The buildings and even the canteen are kept clean, tidy and are fully air-conditioned.

Owing to the high academic performance of our students, our school is one of the top schools in the Kwai Ching District and one of the top secondary schools in Hong Kong.

2. *School Management*

1. The School Management Committee

The School Management Committee consists of 11 members with the Rt. Rev. Dr. Thomas Soo as the Chairman, Dr Alice Yuk as the School Supervisor and Mr. Cheung Chi Yin as the Hon. Treasurer.

2. Staff

There were 67 teaching staff members (including the Principal), 3 laboratory technicians, 8 clerical staff members, 4 teaching assistants, 3 technical support staff members and 11 janitors.

3. Qualifications of the Principal and Teachers in Staff Establishment

- i. 98 % obtained a bachelor's or a higher degree
- ii. 61 % obtained a master's degree
- iii. 2% obtained a doctor's degree
- iv. 100 % received formal teacher training

4. Professional Development of the Principal and Teachers

5. Staff Development Committee

The Staff Development Committee has organized various programs including staff development days, an induction program and team building activities. On Staff Development Days, topics on “School Improvement through Observation of Learning and Teaching”, “Use of Smart Boards” and “Values Education” were discussed. In the T&T program, Prof. Lam Man Ping and Mr. Luk Ka Yin conducted a whole-day workshop on “Enhancing the competency of school team spirit”. Our mentorship scheme, implemented for years, was designed to develop both personal and professional aspects of new teachers and teaching assistants. The first 10 minutes of each staff meeting was used for colleagues’ sharing. Teachers were invited to share their experiences which enhanced our mutual understanding and broadened our horizons. The Staff Development fund, set up by the School Management Committee encouraged and subsidized our colleagues to enroll in courses related to teaching or well-being purposes.

6. Teacher Commendation Scheme

To acknowledge the outstanding teachers and show respect to teachers, the Committee of ‘Respect Our Teachers Campaign’ organized the 15th Teacher Commendation Scheme. Mr. Cheng Hong Yung and Mr. Mak Cheuk Sang were nominated by the teaching staff as our school’s nominees. Mr. Cheng Woon Tak was also nominated by the school as “Outstanding Teacher” organized by the Federation of Parent-Teacher Association Ltd (Kwai Tsing District).

II. ACHIEVEMENTS AND REFLECTION ON MAJOR CONCERNS

Priority 1: Learn to Learn

Area 1: Promoting learning strategies/subject-specific study skills to develop students into independent learners.

One of the 3 achieving strategies: note-taking, pre-lesson preparation, post-lesson revision was to be promoted and developed through subject departments. Each subject panel is to agree on the choice of study skills to be promoted. Evaluations would be done in the first and final term meeting.

1. Peer Lesson Observation

Based on the data from the Peer Lesson Observation, concerning achieving strategies, the rating for teacher clarifying and student practising achieving strategies is 68% & 77% respectively. The rating for teacher clarifying and student practising subject-based study skills is 60% and 67%.

2. Workshop on Memory Skills for F2

On 29-30 Mar, 2010, Super Brain Limited was invited to deliver a 10-hour training course on 'Effective Memory Skill' for our F.2 students. The course ran for 10 hours and spread across 4 sessions on the 2 days. A whole-day workshop on Memory Skills was held for new F1 students on 20 August, 2010 by the Learning and Teaching Section.

3. Course Evaluation Survey

Course evaluation was conducted in the following subjects in May:

F1: Mathematics, History & Chinese History

F2: Chinese, Computer Literacy, Visual Arts & Integrated Science

F3: English, Design & Technology, Home Economics & Geography

F4: Liberal Studies, Combined Science & BAFS

Area 2: Promoting skill-building in teaching

1. Walk Through the Classroom and Workshop on Lesson Observation

Mr. Archie McGlynn was invited to conduct a workshop on classroom observation and post-observation meeting on 30 Nov, 2009. The objective of the workshop was to strengthen teachers' skills in conducting peer lesson observation and in identifying effective pedagogy. It was hoped that with better understanding of the skills involved, there could be more mutual benefits for the 2 teachers involved in the lesson observation.

2. Co-planning Study on Core Subjects

To prepare teachers better for peer lesson observation and to integrate the teaching of achieving strategies and subject-related study skills into the lesson, a co-planning study was arranged in the afternoon on 12 Mar, 2010, involving mainly teachers of Chinese, English, Mathematics and Liberal Studies.

3. Peer Lesson Observation

Teachers did exceedingly well in making the aims of lessons clear (95%), demonstrating effective classroom management (93%) and creating positive classroom ethos for learning and teaching (93%). Students were encouraged to respond and elaborate (93%) and as a whole, 86% teachers considered that learning outcomes have been observed.

Area 3: Accelerating learning (for low achievers in F1 and F2)

To ensure junior form students could build a sound foundation for their future academic development, a series of measures were taken to create a supportive and encouraging learning environment for the low achievers in F1-F2.

1. Form Evaluation Meetings

The Form Evaluation Meetings held from 24-27 November, 2009 drew better focus and concern on classes or students with particular learning problems. Subject panels, form teachers and subject teachers had the chance to understand better the effectiveness of the learning and teaching in their classes.

2. Christmas Tuition Course

The lists of needy students in F1 and F2 were identified and invited to attend a 6-day Christmas tuition course in English and Mathematics.

3. Summer Tuition Course

10-12 underachievers in English and Mathematics were offered a 10-day tuition course in English and Mathematics during the summer vacation to strengthen their foundation in the 2 subjects.

4. F1-F3 Peer Mentorship Program

A Peer Mentorship Program was run for F1-F3 in the 2nd term after the Uniform Test. The bottom 2-3 students in each class were selected to be mentees. The top 2-3 students in each class were listed and Form Teachers gave advice on whether or not they could provide help under the scheme. An interim evaluation was conducted in the form of meetings with the mentors and mentees in April. Very positive feedback from mentees was received. In late May, a survey was conducted. 90% of the mentees believed that the scheme had given them the opportunity to get help from mentors.

Area 4: Promoting eLearning

Installation and orientation of SmartBoards

The installation of 3 Smart boards in Physics Lab, Computer Room & DT Room help making learning a more creative and fun process. Teachers of Physics found the Smartboards most useful.

Area 5: Restructuring Academic Division to effect better learning & teaching

Close coordination is effected by means of regular meetings with C & A Sections and L & T Sections.

Priority 2: Learn to Respect

The main aim of MC2 is to instil self-respect, respect for others and the society in students. The main focuses of the programs are to help students develop respect through fostering their good virtues and good character, so as to form a positive attitude towards life. The Committee had implemented the following activities:

- Setting code of behaviour in classroom
- School Campus Cleanliness Campaign.
- Talk on Value Education for teachers
- Publication of a journal "Era of Respect"

III. OUR LEARNING AND TEACHING

1. *Academic Division*

- Academic Policies: A number of academic policies were formulated including Streaming Policy for remedial classes, enhancement and enrichment classes and other courses held outside school hours.
- Joint School Student Exchange Scheme: A Joint School Student Exchange Scheme was held on 25-27 Nov, 2009 with Munsang College. 12 F4 and F6 students took part. There was very positive feedback from students of both schools.
- English morning news broadcast: English morning news was broadcast for 2 days every week to promote social awareness, a global outlook and listening skills.

2. *Curriculum*

- In accordance with School Homework Policy, the subject departments had to agree on the amount and frequency of homework assigned at different levels.
- F4 subject choice available for F3 students was revised after conducting a trial run of subject selection for F3 students so as to cater better to the interest and ability of our students.
- There were remedial classes and high achievers' classes for junior form students in English Language, Chinese Language and Mathematics.

3. *Policy on Catering for Learner Differences*

- Tutorial classes, on voluntary basis, were arranged for students who would like to improve their English and Maths.
- Christmas and summer remedial classes were arranged for students who did not perform well in the first and final examinations.
- Pull-out program (Forensic Science for F.3-4 students) and program namely "Differentiation Project" embedded in curriculum (in F.4 physics and Chemistry) were organized.

4. *Reading to Learn*

The Reading to Learn program continued its mission to cultivate a reading habit amongst students and encourage extensive reading. A number of activities were carried out: a 15-minute Morning Reading Scheme, book fairs, sharing session of teachers and peers.

5. *Foster e-learning*

- Promotion of smart-board (MC1): A workshop for using smart-board in teaching and learning was held.
- WiseLearning system: WiseLearning was introduced to LS, English and Chinese departments.
- Video On Demand (VOD): LS department had a pilot run of the VOD system. The system is now open to all subjects for playing videos for teaching and learning.

6. *Cultural and Art Activities*

Since junior forms, their sense of appreciation via the exploration of performances, museums and galleries has been enhanced with the guidelines provided in the "Art Lovers Passport" issued by the Cultural Promotion Committee. Besides a variety of free visits in visual and performing arts, students enjoyed 104 paid visits in the fabulous performances of Hong Kong

Arts Festival via the Young Friends program. Form 2 student, Lam Nga Yan was awarded a scholarship for her flair for the arts in the “Arts Ambassadors-in-school Scheme”, organized by Hong Kong Arts Development Council. In response to the Other Learning Experiences in aesthetic development, a broad scope of video program was presented among senior forms so as to help understand art through culture.

7. Chinese Activities Promotion Team

The Chinese Activities Promotion Team is a newly formed students team. It aims to raise students’ learning incentives and deepen their knowledge of Chinese culture by organizing diversified activities such as writing competition, lantern riddles and film shows.

8. English Award Scheme

English Award Scheme aims at organizing activities to enhance students’ motivation in using and learning English. Every school day, the English Corner would be open to let students immerse in an English speaking atmosphere by playing English board and card games, and listen to English music. In Feb 2010, EAS organized a Singing Contest, where 30 teams from F.1-3 and 9 teams from F.4-6 competed. In April 2010, EAS organized a game stall and a talk on “Living English”.

9. Putonghua Promotion Committee

Putonghua Promotion Committee is an organization which aims at promoting the use of Putonghua in students’ daily life. It is hoped that students’ interest in Putonghua can be cultivated by holding diversified and appealing activities, like dubbing competitions, singing contest, morning sharing and game stall .

10. Environmental Education

In order to carry out the greening programs smoothly and successfully, Environmental Education team was set up in 2009. The Green committee which consists of both teachers and students is to work out a plan on greening our school. In addition, monitoring, reviewing and improving the greening programs in our school are also duties of the team.

V. SUPPORT FOR STUDENT DEVELOPMENT

1. *Non-Academic Development Division*

The main aim of the Non-Academic Development Division (NAD) was to ensure the non-academic development of students aligned with the school mission, visions and needs of students. Apart from the coordination work of various sections and teams in providing non-academic development programs for students, the NAD also implemented the following programs:

- F.1 Adaptation Program
- Student-Teacher Conference
- Mission Kaleidoscope Scheme for junior form students
- Leadership Training, e.g. the Adventurership Program
- The LAMWOOER Awards
- The APASO survey

2. *Moral and Civic Education*

- School assemblies and form teacher lessons were arranged on Day 6 to foster students' spiritual growth and to promote moral, civic and life education. The topics of school assemblies and form teacher lessons aligned with the school concerns and focuses, such as self-understanding, self-management, integrity and respect.
- National education activities were held around the National Day, e.g. flag hoisting ceremony, talk, board display and game stall on contemporary China.
- The *Civic Time* magazine regarding the development of Mainland China within the past 60 years was published.
- Twelve F.4 students participated in the ICAC 'I Mission' Project.
- Sixteen of our F.3, F.4 and F.6 students participated in the SRACP Mock Trial Competition Project.
- Students participated in the Cookie Campaign organized by the Helping Hand. \$13,200 was raised to sponsor the elderly services in Hong Kong.

3. *Christian Fellowship*

Besides regular meetings after school every Friday, the following activities were held:

- Students cell groups
- Gospel Week
- The theme of the year was "Thousands-year Love". There were film shows, band show and talk. Miss Ho Ching Ching and Rev. Samson Fan Chun Ho held a sharing meeting and an evangelical meeting.

4. *Guidance Section*

The objectives of Guidance Section this year were to cultivate the attitude of mutual respect in interpersonal skills. The objectives were achieved with the efforts of Program Team, Outside School Service Team and Peer Counseling Team. The main activities of the year were:

- The Guidance Week, Big Brother and Big Sister Scheme and Social services provided for members of Fu Hong Society and Po Leung Kuk.
- Peer counselors were trained to help junior form students.
- Regular programs on sex education, stress management, learning motivation and computer addiction were held to equip students with knowledge and skills of tackling various events they might experience.

5. Discipline Section

To help students face challenges of various kinds, some preventive measures were taken:

- Police talks on prevention of drug abuse and juvenile delinquency.
- Policy on handling drug abuse cases was formulated to equip teachers with the knowledge to handle cases.

School prefects contributed immensely in keeping school discipline and maintaining school order.

6. Careers Section

The following were some of the activities organized by the Careers Section:

- Alumni-Mentor Program
- One day @ HKU Program
- Job shadowing day at Architectural Services Department
- JA success skills workshop
- Career Challenge 2009
- F.1 Adaptation Program
- Talk & workshop on admission interview
- F.3 parents' night for NSS elective selection
- Summer work experience scheme for F5 & F7
- A wide variety of talks on exam, interviewing skills, JUPAS application and alumni sharing for sixth form students were held.

7. Students' Union (SU)

The Students' Union serves as a bridge between students and the school. Other than the routine services, some competitions were organized this year like 'Dance Sing Show' Competition, 'Drama Show Talent' Competition and Super Class Competition. A Joint School Student Exchange Program with CCC Ming Kei College and YWCA Hioe Tjo Yoeng College were arranged this year.

8. Houses

Apart from Sports Days, Football Match, Debates and Board Design Competition, we had an inter-house activities week this year. The overall champion was Green House.

9. Extra-curricular Activities Section (ECA)

The Extra-Curricular Activities Section aimed at planning and providing multifarious educational activities for all students. We coordinated more than 50 activity groups, inter-house competitions and school picnic. Besides, we provided community services for F.3 or above students and established the ECA information platform on our school webpage. We promoted and planned other learning experiences (OLE) for the NSS students, so as to widen their horizons and develop their potential.

Student ECA Team and the Community Service Ambassador Team were set up to promote extra-curricular activities and community services. To promote the extra-curricular activities and community services, the following programs were held: ECA Introduction Week, Leadership Training Program and ECA Website Quiz. Other activities were Christmas Party with the Elderly and Express our Care through Telephone and Sunshine Action. We also helped to organize the CYC Elderly Day, Flag Selling Services and Outstanding Community Service Award.

10. Student Health Promotion Committee

Vaccination service, Dental Care Scheme, Healthy Food Selling Days and Sports Weeks were organized to foster a healthy and active lifestyle among youngsters.

11. Parent-Teacher Association (PTA)

PTA organized a number of activities, such as parents' talk, school uniform recycle campaigns, picnic, orienteering competitions and F1 support group meeting. The parents' group “「家」添茶座” organized ten meetings. Two Saturday afternoon parents' talks on drug abuse and internet addiction were organized. They also prepared a delicious lunch buffet for teachers and staff at the beginning of the school year. Twelve meetings of parents' fellowship were organized for those Christian parents. The Volunteer Team assisted in the examination invigilation, students' outing activities and library clerical work. Besides, PTA donated funds to subsidize various student activities such as Adventure Ship and Leadership Training Program.

12. Old Students' Association (OSA)

Our newly built Lam Woo OSA website (www.skhlamwoo-osa.hk) was launched this year. In Nov, 2009, we also had our 6th basketball tournament in which over 12 teams of old students from over 30 academic years participated. An Alumni-Mentor Program was started this year. Scholarships for Services and Whole Person Development were awarded to six students.

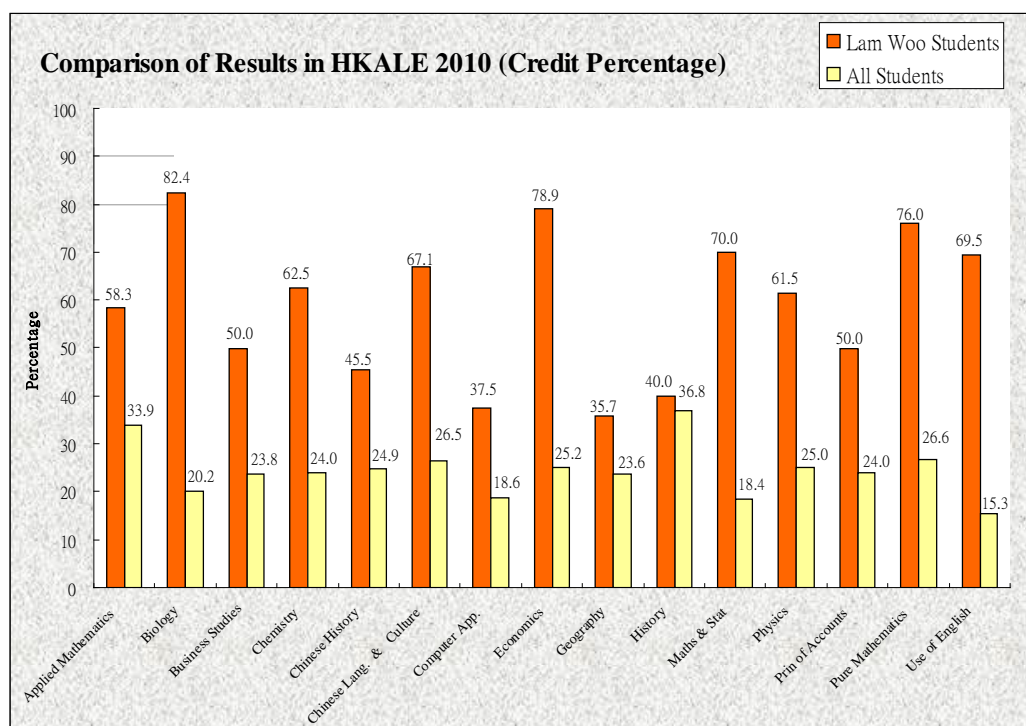
1. Early Admission Scheme (EAS)

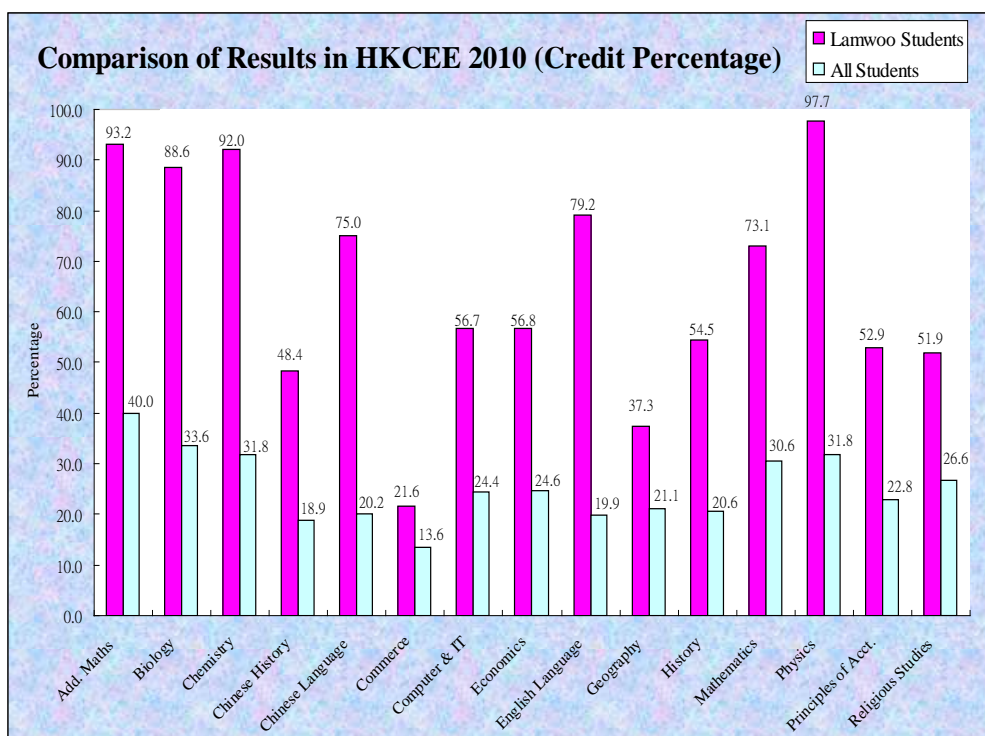

4. *HKCE Examination 2010*

212 students sat the HKCE Examination. In English Language and Chinese Language, they scored 55 Level 5* and 271 Level 4 and 5. In other subjects, they scored 267 distinctions and 540 credits. Each student scored an average of 5.3 distinctions (or Level 5*) and credits (or Levels 4 and 5). 178 of our F.5 students (84%) obtained 14 points or more from the best 6 subjects. 104 students were promoted to F.6 in our school. Yiu Sze Wan scored 10 distinctions. Ma Wing Ki and Choy Chun Lap scored 8 distinctions 1 credit. Altogether 21 students scored 6 distinctions or above and 20 of them were eligible to apply for the early admission to university in the coming academic year.
